Declutter Your Spiritual Life

Remove the distractions and seek Jesus.

You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. Jeremiah 29:13 (NIV)

It has been a long day and you're ready for a treat. A bowl of ice cream would just hit the spot. In the kitchen, you find your utensil drawer is stuck shut again. You jiggle and yank the handle, finally releasing whatever had blocked it. Staring at the jumbled contents, you sigh. All you need is the ice cream scoop. Shuffling through various wooden spoons, silicone spatulas, and stainless-steel knives—each created for only one purpose—you finally find the familiar rubberized handle. Now to work it free from the tangled mass.

That drawer, with all its useful and helpful items, sometimes reminds me of the way life can get cluttered with busywork. Like the garlic press I recently purchased, I always find ways to cram one more volunteer opportunity or social engagement into my week. Sometimes I lose track of the point. Why am I doing it and who am I doing it for? With my focus split in a hundred directions, none of these things bring me—or others—closer to Jesus. Finally, I empty the drawer, carefully selecting which utensils to keep and which to donate. Now I'll be able to find what I need with ease.

I need to do the same with my free time. Things that distract me from Jesus or from serving Him better should be removed. Psalm 27:8 reminds me, "You have said, 'Seek my face.' My heart says to you, 'Your face, LORD, do I seek'" (ESV). I want to declutter my soul, to seek Him with all my heart and find Him, and to reach for Him and recognize His touch deep inside.

How about you? Is it time to declutter your life, remove the distractions, and seek Jesus?

Lord, Help us to declutter our lives that we might seek you with all our hearts.

An Advent Tradition Returns to Northern Virginia

Starting in the 1980's some local UMW units began gathering together for an annual Advent prayer breakfast and hymn sing. The idea was to begin the Advent season in a spirit-filled, faithful manner with Christ at the center. Of course, being UMW, there was also Mission, fellowship, food and fund. Unfortunately, COVID caused the cease of this decades-old tradition for 2020 and 2021. But we're back! On December 3, 2021 over 50 attendees came to the Advent prayer breakfast hosted by the UWF unit at **Old Bridge UMC** in Woodbridge, VA. Members from six congregations along with District officers and at-large members attended. Ages ranged from about 10 to 94.

For Missions, attendees brought food donations for our local food bank. We also donated cards and signed them during the breakfast. They'll be used as greetings in multiple Mission efforts underway in our UWF district.

The Pastor at Old Bridge, Kyungsuk Cho and his wife, Hyesook, started us off with the Korean version of one of our Christmas Carols. He then blessed our bountiful breakfast buffet. After the meal, we heard an Advent message prepared by Rev. Dr. Katie Phillips about Mary and her miracle pregnancy. While this message was reverent, it also had a splash of humor as Katie performs Improv Comedy in her free time.

Our breakfast ended with a rousing sing-a-long of Christmas carols. An inspirational closing prayer was delivered by Pastor Woodard of Dumfries UMC. We all left the breakfast energized and ready to **keep Christ as the reason for the season**.
