REPORT FROM THE NoVA DISTRICT UWF TREASURER

At District Day, the annual meeting of the Northern Virginia District of United Women in Faith, held at Mount Olivet on October 21, two important items on the agenda were discussed and adopted. They were the Administrative & Membership Development Fund (A&MD) Budget for 2024 in the amount of \$5,605 and the Pledge to Mission to the Virginia Conference UWF in the amount of \$42,500. Christmas Ministry for the Inmates at the Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women

Here's a brief overview of the ministry:

- 1. In existence since 1998, the year the correctional center opened
- 2. Sponsored through GraceInside, Virginia's Prison Chaplain Service
- 3. Supported entirely by donations from individuals, churches, and organizations throughout the state of Virginia and beyond
- 4. Administered through Effort Baptist Church, Palmyra, VA, which is the donation delivery point
- 5. Each inmate at the Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women receives the gifts listed below

Here's a complete list of the approved donations. Please note that the correctional center does not permit ANY substitute or additional items.

Hygiene Items (place in a gallon zip lock bag)

- 1. One individually wrapped toothbrush (must be in the original container). Battery-operated toothbrushes are NOT permitted.
- 2. One tube of toothpaste, 6 oz. (must be in the original container).
- 3. One deodorant stick, 2.6 oz. (as close to 2.6 oz. as possible but no larger); no spray or roll-on
- 4. One bottle of shampoo, 15 oz. -18 oz (as close as possible to 15 oz. but no larger than 18 oz)
- 5. One bottle of lotion, 15 oz.-18 oz (as close as possible to 15 oz. but no larger than 18 oz)

Greeting Cards and Stationery Items

- 1. Christmas cards and greeting cards for all occasions. All cards are sorted by a local team of volunteers after they're received. Please try to avoid purchasing cards that contain aluminum foil on the card or envelope flap.
- 2. Stationery items writing paper of any size and envelopes either 3 5/8 x 6 ½ or 4 1/8 x 9 ½
- 3. Forever postage stamps (used to send donation acknowledgment letters); please place them in a separate zip lock bag.
- 4. Wooden pencils (unsharpened)

These funds are used to purchase any shortage of Christmas gift items and to support inmates in other ways, such as providing classroom materials; providing worship supplies; or paying travel expenses for funeral or deathbed visits. Free the Girls (FTG)



ATTENTION! BRAS FOR FREE THE GIRLS NO LONGER BEING ACCEPTED

For several years, St. John's United Women in Faith (formerly United Methodist Women) has been collecting new and gently used bras for "Free The Girls," a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that was launched to provide job opportunities to women rescued from sex trafficking. SADLY, THIS MISSION OUTREACH HAS COME TO AN END.

Free The Girls (FTG) has notified St. John's that it will no longer accept bras, but instead is "... expanding our focus to include additional reintegrative strategies for survivors of trafficking." It is the hope of FTG that we will continue our partnership by investing in its work going forward with financial donations (www.freethegirls.org).

That being said, we are researching other organizations that may welcome new or gently used bras for their clientele, e.g., domestic violence and homeless shelters. Before you race off to online or local clothing stores, **listen to Joshua Becker** https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dvfD48K1rCg **for practical ways to enjoy clothing** without falling into the traps of consumerism: 7 *Steps to a Minimalist Wardrobe*. Shop with a friend or family member who has also seen the 4-minute video.
- Choose aluminum cans over plastic bottles. Plastic can be successfully recycled just once or twice, and only 3–6% of plastic that makes it to the recycling bin is truly recycled. On the other hand, aluminum can be recycled infinitely—as long as you put the can into the recycle bin.
- Enjoy your Thanksgiving celebrations, **starting with a sustainability mindset**: reusable dinnerware, cloth napkins, less meat/more plant-based foods, a plan to use leftovers, a kitchen set up to maximize compostables and minimize trash, even washable rags for cleanup instead of wasting trees with paper towels.
